## Chestnut Festival a Success!

Native Plant Society Members Jim Whitley, Nancy and George Brakhage, Marge McDermott, Jean Graebner, Don Garvin, Becky Erickson, Chris Angelo, Judy Turner, Pam Haverland, Laura Ellifrit, and Nadia Navarrete-Tindall helped to staff a booth and answer questions at the 3rd Annual Chestnut Festival at the UMC-Horticulture and Agroforestry Research Center (HARC) in New Franklin (see article in October newsletter). As usual, members brought native plant seedlings and we had nature books to sell to raise funds for our society activities.

The highlight of our participation was a morning 'Wreath Making Demonstration' sponsored by the Society and the Native Plant Program of UMC-Bradford Research Center. The demonstration was led by Floral Designer Cheryl Jensen and NPS-HC President Nadia Navarrete-Tindall. Many of the 50 or more people attending the workshop were so interested in learning more about wreath making that we continued the demonstration outside next to our booth through the rest of the festival. The day was perfect to be outside and there was a constant flow of people admiring Cheryl's arrangements, several of which sold for a total of \$60. One of the wreaths was raffled among participants.

An additional activity was a walking tour lead by Nadia where 25 or more participants visited research and demonstration plots. Native forbs, grasses, or shrubs have been established by Nadia and colleagues to evaluate their potential in landscaping, conservation, and for wildlife. Many thanks to members and volunteers to make our participation a big success!

## Amendment Proposed to Hawthorn Chapter By-laws to Ensure Update of our Archives

The system to keep Hawthorn Chapter archives complete, yet available for research, involves cooperation with the State Historical Society of Missouri. The archivist at the Historical Society receives each issue of the newsletter, "complimentary." He/she includes it in the Society files there. The individual newsletters will be bound and may be accessed by using the catalogue number, 65201-7298, or can be asked for by name. Permanent archives of the original documents pertaining to the founding of our chapter reside at the Western Manuscripts which is also located in Ellis Library.

Dean Hargis, Archivist at the Historical Society, presented us with a file containing copies of all of the original newsletters that are now housed in the archives. The collection is almost complete but there are a few missing issues. Members who have long-time files are asked to contact either Nancy Brakhage or Jean Graebner if you think you may be able to help with the missing issues.

The following amendment to the Hawthorn Chapter by-laws was recommended by the board at a meeting September 29th at the Uprise Bakery café to ensure continued update of the archives.

At present Article V, Section 5 describes the responsibilities of the treasurer and concludes with this statement: **"The Treasurer shall maintain a roster of all active members."** The board proposes to amend the final Section as follows: **"The Treasurer shall maintain a roster of all active members. It shall also be the Treasurer's responsibility to update our official archives which reside at the State Historical Society of Missouri, located in Ellis Library on the MU campus, by confirming that the Society remains on the list of "complimentary" recipients of our chapter newsletter and that the mailing address of the Society remains current."**

The by-laws permit amendments by a simple majority of those attending at any regular meeting. This amendment will be presented for approval at the November meeting.

**Upcoming wreath making workshop**

We will have our Wreath making workshop on December 4<sup>th</sup> from 1-4 pm. Cedar to make the wreaths will be provided. You should bring a small "paddle" (spool) of craft painted wire (green) about 26 gauge, and a straw wreath base 12 to 14-inch diameter or your choice. These generally are available at Walmart or hobby stores and are inexpensive. If you ever got around to cleaning it up, bring the one you used last year. If you can, bring natural materials to share for decoration. Examples are grass seed heads, dried flowers or leaves, bittersweet, lotus pods, etc. Also, if you have them, bring pliers and hand pruners, gloves if you want them. We will work in our basement.

Directions to wreath workshop: Providence Road all the way south to stoplight at Rockbridge ELEMENTARY School. Continue straight through this light onto Route K (the road to McBaine). Go 1.3 miles and turn left onto Hill Creek Road. Go another 1.3 miles (across bridge and up huge hill) to 7852 on the left. Our parking is limited but there is room for several cars. If walking is uncomfortable, please park in the drive. Others can continue a short distance past the drive to Logwood Lane on the right and park along it. There is a circle at the end of Logwood for easy turn around. Hang on to these directions as this is the last newsletter before December 4.
